Travel & Tourism	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explore the marketing potential of the sanctuary with local Convention and Visitor Bureaus. • Recommend sanctuary actions to enhance visitor awareness, appreciation and enjoyment of the sanctuary in a manner that is consistent with resource protection and sanctuary stewardship. Advise and assist with successful implementation of the Sanctuary Classic recreational fishing and photography contest (should it return to the area in summer 2013) 		M
